

## Partial Action Plan No. 7 Fact Sheet

The Lower Manhattan Development Corporation (LMDC) has prepared the following Partial Action Plan with regard to the \$2 billion federal grant for the World Trade Center disaster recovery and rebuilding efforts administered by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). LMDC has received additional funding by a more recent \$783 million grant from HUD for damaged properties and businesses (including the restoration of utility infrastructure) as well as economic revitalization related to the terrorist attacks at the World Trade Center. Partial Action Plan No.7 proposes the allocation of \$164 million for the development and implementation of the World Trade Center Site Memorial and Cultural Program, \$3.25 million for Tourism, and approximately \$8.81 million for the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation's planning and administrative activities. The total proposed allocation is approximately \$176 million. Key components of Partial Action Plan No.7 are described below:

#### **Purpose of Partial Action Plan**

- To meet urgent community development needs that arose from the events of September 11, 2001.
- > To meet long-term economic recovery needs including redevelopment and revitalization of the affected areas.

#### World Trade Center Site Memorial and Cultural Program Description

- > Activities related to planning for the World Trade Center Site Memorial, including
- Iand acquisition of the 130 Liberty Site;
- > Deconstruction and clean-up of Deutsche Bank building on the 130 Liberty Site;
- > Legal and environmental consulting related to these activities; and
- > Public outreach related to these activities.

#### **Tourism Program Description**

- > Funding for free Tribeca Film Festival programs and guides; and
- > Funding for a portion of production of Splendor of Florence Festival.

#### LMDC Planning and Administrative Activities

- > LMDC is conducting several studies on issues such as transportation, traffic, housing and related amenities, open space, and economic development capacity needs, and potential.
- > LMDC carries out extensive public outreach and coordination efforts related to off-site planning studies.
- LMDC's outreach to the affected communities, the public at large, government agencies and officials including large-scale public hearings and meetings, printed newsletters and reports, up-to-date, comprehensive, and interactive website (www.Renewnyc.com), and extensive electronic communications.
- > Legal, investigative, and audit activities needed to administer LMDC programs.
