



Work on 130 Liberty is proceeding well and on schedule. We are currently installing the scaffolding and doing related abatement work. The following is some information that may be of interest to you:

Public Information Session

On October 24th at 6 PM we will hold a public information session on the project. We will begin with a presentation that will include details on deconstruction logistics, air monitoring and emergency plans. Following the presentation, a variety of people involved in the project will be available to answer questions. The location is being confirmed and a separate announcement about this event will be sent out next week. But please mark the date and time in your calendar.

Weekend Work

For the next several weeks, work will be taking place on weekends. The work is contained within the building or within tents on the scaffolding to mitigate any noise or other disturbance to the community. This weekend work will enable the deconstruction to be completed as quickly as possible.

Air Monitoring Update

When scaffolding began on September 14th, we also began our 24-hour, 7-day per week air monitoring program. To date only two air samples have been found to be slightly elevated above the EPA site-specific trigger levels. On September 28th, the day abatement work on the roof was completed, asbestos and silica results for roof - top air samples taken were found to be slightly above the trigger levels. Activities at 130 Liberty Street on this date included completion of the roof abatement, which included final cleaning and gravel removal, vacuuming and wet-wiping all roof surfaces.

In accordance with the deconstruction plan, the regulators (Environmental Protection Agency, New York State Dept. of Labor and New York City Department of Environmental Protection) were notified upon receipt of the results and the roof area was re-cleaned utilizing additional supplemental wet-methods. On September 30th, additional air samples were collected on the roof and no asbestos was detected. The regulatory agencies are satisfied that these limited exceedences did not pose any health threat to the workers or the community.
