



Handmade greeting card made in honor of birthday in 1944 of Mordechai Chaim Rumkowski, head of the Judenrat in the Lodz Ghetto. It includes a poem in Yiddish extolling Rumkowski's virtues, with the first letters of each line spelling out his name. The other side contains a color portrait of Rumkowski, and a micrographic rendition of Song of Songs in the shape of a book. This card is representative of the genre of objects produced in the ghetto feeding a cult of personality around Rumkowski. Bamberger</p> <p>ORAL HISTORY - REVSON Testimony Bamberger, Joseph A. 1990-12-09 English</p> <p>Videotape testimony of Joseph A. Bamberger, born in Hamburg, Germany in 1927. He recalls his family's Orthodoxy; his father teaching in a Jewish school; attending a Jewish boys' school; participation in Maccabi; his father's trip to Palestine and return, thinking he could not make a living there; anti-Semitic harassment; being warned prior to Kristallnacht; his father leaving (he went to the synagogue to rescue a Torah); Gestapo coming to arrest his father; his father's return days later (they attribute his survival to the Torah); difficulties trying to emigrate; receiving exit visas outside of the quota due to his father's friend (his future father-in-law); ship travel to the United States; and bringing the rescued Torah. Mr. Bamberger discusses the continued importance of the Torah to his family. He is joined by his wife, Dorothy Frank Bamberger, whose family came to the United States from Hamburg in 1938. They discuss their reluctance to return to Germany, despite many other relatives having done so. They show documents, objects (including the Torah), and photographs. Testimony of Dorothy Frank Bamberger Bamberger, Dorothy Frank	1991-01-10	Testimony of Dorothy Frank Bamberger ORAL HISTORY - REVSON Testimony Bamberger, Dorothy Frank 1991-01-10 English Videotape testimony of Dorothy Bamberger nee Frank, born in Hamburg, Germany in 1931. She recounts the history of her mother's and father's families; her father's modern Orthodoxy; their affluent life style; visiting her maternal relatives in Prague and a small Czech town; contrasting her formal German relatives with her casual Czech relatives; her family insulating her from anti-Semitism; a Nazi edict resulting in termination of employment of their non-Jewish maid; her father concealing his Jewish identity in public to avoid anti-Semitic violence; her mother's insistence that they leave Germany; liquidating their property; German police strip searching them at the Dutch border; and emigration to the United States from England. Mrs. Bamberger discusses their reduced financial circumstances; learning her grandmother and aunt committed suicide after receiving deportation notices; her father's efforts to receive compensation from Germany for their property losses; and many details of the European cultures of her childhood.
